USP-Stanford University Summer Programme

7 – 20 May 2007

In 2006, 15 Stanford students, led by Prof Don Emmerson, visited USP and engaged with USP students in a dialogue session. This year, an exchange visit will take place under a new USP-Stanford University Summer Programme. 15 USP students will visit Stanford University for two weeks, from 7 to 20 May 2007. The theme is "Multiculturalism: Singaporean and American Perspectives".

University of British Columbia (UBC)-USP Study Programme on Chinese Migration in Southeast Asia

6 – 25 May 2007

This is a unique field trip study which will bring 11 UBC and 9 USP students to Guangzhou, Hong Kong, Singapore, Kuala Lumpur and Malacca. The purpose of the study programme is to tour areas in southern China where the great majority of overseas Chinese migrants originated, as well as to study the history of how these migrants settled in Southeast Asia, compared to those who migrated to North America.

4th Sino-Singapore Undergraduate Exchange Programme (in China)

16 – 30 May 2007

The Sino-Singapore Undergraduate Exchange Programme was spearheaded by the respective Ministries of Education of Singapore and China in 2003. Established to broaden bilateral ties between Singapore and China through the interaction of outstanding undergraduates from both countries, the first three runs of the programme were a success. In its fourth run this year, the Chinese delegation visited Singapore earlier in March 2007. From 16 to 30 May 2007, 13 USP students will be part of the Singapore delegation to visit China.

Youth Expedition Project

15 May – 3 June 2007

USP students will embark on a Youth Expedition Project called 'Big Hands, Bigger Hearts 3 (BHBH3)' to Bago City, Philippines. BHBH3 will focus on improving education in Bago City. This includes building a day-care centre which will serve myriad purpose, e.g. as a centre for young children, a library, a reading corner, and a centre for volunteerism by the local college students. BHBH3 will also conduct educational camps for children in elementary schools, and raise funds for a "feeding programme" which sponsors nutritious food for malnourished children.

George Washington University (GWU)-USP Dialogue Series (in Singapore)

26 May – 3 June 2007

This dialogue series started in 2006. Now in its second year, the theme is "Global health focusing on HIV/AIDS". GWU hosted USP students in Washington earlier in February 2007. USP will in turn be hosting a group of students from GWU's Dean's Scholars Programme from 26 May to 3 June 2007. Student workshops, visits to relevant institutions and meetings/dialogues with various interest groups on global health issues are being planned.
